 There had been some concern over reported difficulties with the eCounting solution used at recent by-elections in Hillhead and Hamilton. Scottish Government had discussed with Logica and they had stressed that while the software was the same as will be used in 2012 the rest of the arrangements were not, another contractor had been responsible for these counts. There had been an issue with scanning in Glasgow but that was due to the hardware used. Other concerns were raised regarding the adjudication rates. ACTION Scottish Government to investigate and report to next Project Board and then EMB. It was apparent from both by-elections that ROs need to ensure that they adequately resource and plan for ballot box opening and paper preparation. Mis-oriented papers will have a significant impact on scanning times. 	Scottish Government

Ballot Boxes	
Final design of the ballot box is awaited. Description has been seen by Scottish Government with an insert which should prevent papers from being jumbled in transit. However, SG hadn't seen the sample, only a description of it. The prototype is expected imminently

Adjudication	
 Adjudication issues would be discussed at the forthcoming seminars in February / March. Key issues from by-elections seems to be 2 against second candidate etc. Guidance is clear that this is not acceptable – there is no first preference. 	
Recounts	
eCounting Project Board had discussed a paper on recounts. Note that a recount is only possible after the whole system and count has been cleared down. ROs should ensure that they communicate and involved observers through out the process to ensure that they are happy with the process at each stage to minimise the chance of recount requests. Clear communications before the count are also important and at each stage – verification and scanning.
