	A memo dated 9 February 2015 from MP to RO's and ERO's was circulated. It was noted that proposals offered were recommendations and not directions and it was agreed this was appreciated by all RO's and ERO's.

	It is understood that some planning is underway by the Cabinet Office although the official line is that ROs always need to be prepared for an election at short notice.	
	Police Guidance on Electoral Fraud	



IM/AON/CH/RJ attended a briefing held by Police Scotland on 5 March 2015. It was noted that Superintendent Jim Baird continues to be National Police Liaison and that guidance remains the same as the last election. It was also noted that issues reported to Police Scotland regarding Registration, Personation, and Secrecy at Postal Votes Opening at SIR were being addressed. GB suggested Presiding Officers should phone Election Offices on any potential personation issues rather than contacting Police Scotland directly. It was agreed that EMB would raise protocol flexibility issues with JB.	All
